## Exercise 1: Gap Fill - Choosing "A," "An," or "The"

- 1. We saw an owl in the tree last night. ✓ Explanation: "Owl" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."
- I bought an apple and a banana from the market. ✓
  Explanation: "Apple" starts with a vowel sound (an), while "banana" starts with a consonant sound (a).
- 3. She has an idea for the new project. **Explanation:** "Idea" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."
- They visited a museum in London. ✓
  Explanation: "Museum" starts with a consonant sound, so we use "a."
- 5. I watched an interesting documentary about space. **Explanation:** "Interesting" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."
- 6. There is a university in my town. **✓ Explanation:** Although "university" starts with "u," it makes a "yoo" sound, which is a consonant sound. Use "a."
- 7. He found an old book in the attic. **Explanation:** "Old" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."
- 8. We stayed in a hotel near the beach. **Explanation:** "Hotel" starts with a consonant sound, so we use "a."
- 9. My father is a doctor. ✓ Explanation: "Doctor" starts with a consonant sound, so we use "a."
- 10. I saw an elephant at the zoo. **✓ Explanation:** "Elephant" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."

## **Exercise 2: Error Correction – Articles**

- 1. X I saw a eagle flying in the sky.
  - ✓ I saw an eagle flying in the sky.

Explanation: "Eagle" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."

- 2. X We visited **the France** last year.
  - We visited France last year.

**Explanation:** Countries **do not** usually take "the," unless they include words like "United" or "Kingdom" (e.g., "the United States").

- 3. X She is **an** university student.
  - She is a university student.



**Explanation:** "University" starts with a "yoo" sound, which is a consonant sound, so we use "a."

- 4. X My mother bought **the** milk from the supermarket.
  - My mother bought milk from the supermarket.

**Explanation:** We do **not** use "the" for **uncountable nouns** when speaking generally.

- 5. X He is playing **a** basketball with his friends.
  - ✓ He is playing (no article) basketball with his friends.

**Explanation:** Sports do **not** take articles before them.

- 6. X We stayed in **an** hotel near the beach.
  - We stayed in a hotel near the beach.

Explanation: "Hotel" starts with a consonant sound, so we use "a."

- 7. X She always listens to a classical music.
  - ✓ She always listens to (no article) classical music.

Explanation: "Music" is uncountable, so we do not use "a" before it.

- 8.  $\times$  There is **a** apple in my bag.
  - There is an apple in my bag.

**Explanation:** "Apple" starts with a vowel sound, so we use "an."

- 9. X We went to a school where my father studied.
  - We went to the school where my father studied.

Explanation: If we are talking about a specific school, we use "the."

10. I want to buy an umbrella because it's raining. (Correct!)

**Explanation:** "Umbrella" starts with a vowel sound, so "an" is correct.

- Use "an" before words that start with vowel sounds (not just vowel letters!).
