Exercise 1: Conversation Completion – Past Continuous vs. Past Simple (Answers)

Sarah: Hi John! What were you doing (you/do) last night around 8 p.m.? John: Oh, I was watching (watch) a movie when my sister called (call) me. Sarah: Really? I tried (try) to call you, but you didn't answer (not answer) your phone. John: Sorry about that! My phone didn't ring (not ring), maybe there was a problem. Sarah: No worries! What movie were you watching (you/watch)? John: I was watching (watch) a comedy, but then my dad changed (change) the channel! Sarah: Oh no! What did you do (you/do) then?

John: I went (go) to my room and read (read) a book instead.

📌 Key Takeaways:

- Use Past Continuous (*was/were* + *verb-ing*) for ongoing actions in the past.
- Use Past Simple for completed actions that interrupt an ongoing action (e.g., "while I was watching TV, my sister called.").

Exercise 2: Multiple Choice – Past Continuous, Past Simple, or Present Perfect (Answers)

- 1. She was sleeping when I arrived. (b) was sleeping
 - (Past Continuous for an ongoing action interrupted by Past Simple "arrived.")
- 2. They have never seen that film before. (c) have never seen
 - (Present Perfect for experience; "never" suggests an action until now.)
- 3. While we were walking in the park, we saw a dog. (b) were walking



- (Past Continuous for an ongoing action, interrupted by Past Simple "saw.")
- 4. I haven't finished my homework yet. (a) haven't finished
 - (Present Perfect with "yet" because the action is relevant to now.)
- 5. He fell asleep while he was watching TV. (a) fell
 - (Past Simple for completed action; "was watching" is background action.)
- 6. My mother was working when I got home. (b) was working
 - (Past Continuous for an ongoing action interrupted by "got home.")
- 7. I broke my phone yesterday! (a) broke
 - (Past Simple for a completed action with a past time reference "yesterday.")
- 8. He has never been to Japan before. (b) has never been
 - (Present Perfect for life experience "never before.")
- 9. When I called, she was cooking dinner. (b) was cooking
 - (Past Continuous for an action happening at the moment of interruption.)
- 10. We **have lived** in this city since 2010. (b) have lived
- (Present Perfect for an action that started in the past and continues now.)

📌 Key Takeaways:

- Past Continuous for ongoing past actions interrupted by Past Simple.
- Present Perfect for experiences and actions continuing up to now.
- **Past Simple** for **completed past actions** with a specific time (*yesterday, last week, etc.*).
