Exercise 1: Fill in the Gaps (Choosing the Correct Conditional Form)

- 1. If you mix red and blue, it makes purple.
 - → Zero conditional → General fact
- 2. If we leave now, we will arrive early.
 - → First conditional → Likely future event
- 3. If I had more money, I would travel the world.
 - \rightarrow Second conditional \rightarrow Hypothetical situation in the present
- 4. If you eat too much fast food, you get sick.
 - → Zero conditional → General fact
- 5. If I were you, I wouldn't say that!
 - \rightarrow Second conditional \rightarrow Hypothetical situation giving advice
- 6. If the sun **shines** tomorrow, we **will go** to the beach.
 - → First conditional → Likely future event
- 7. If she **studied** harder, she **would pass** the exam.
 - \rightarrow Second conditional \rightarrow Hypothetical present situation
- 8. If you **touch** fire, you **get** burned.
 - → Zero conditional → General fact
- 9. If we **find** a wallet, we **should return** it.

→ First conditional → Expected action in the future ****** Second for hypothetical also works

- 10. If he **won** the lottery, he **might buy** a yacht.
 - → Second conditional → Hypothetical future event



Exercise 2: Multiple Choice (Choosing the Correct Conditional Type) ANSWERS

1. If I study hard, I will pass the exam. 🔽

→ First conditional → Likely future event

2. If I were taller, I would play basketball professionally. 🔽

→ Second conditional → Hypothetical situation

- 3. If you heat ice, it melts into water.
 - → Zero conditional → Scientific fact
- 4. If I had enough money, I might go on vacation. 🔽
 - \rightarrow Second conditional \rightarrow Hypothetical situation
- 5. If we take a taxi, we **won't** be late. \checkmark \Rightarrow First conditional \Rightarrow Likely future event
- 6. If he had more time, he could finish the project. 🔽
 - \rightarrow Second conditional \rightarrow Hypothetical situation
- 7. If you touch an electric wire, you get a shock. 🔽
 - → Zero conditional → General truth
- 8. If she **misses** the bus, she will take a taxi. 🗹
 - \rightarrow First conditional \rightarrow Likely future event
- 9. If I were the president, I would change the laws. 🗹
 - → Second conditional → Hypothetical situation
- 10. If the weather is nice, we will have a picnic. 🔽
 - → First conditional → Likely future event
