

Third Conditional – Worksheet 1 - ANSWERS

Exercise 1: Gap-Fill (Using the Correct Verb Form in Both Clauses) – Answers

1. If she **had studied**, she **would have passed** the exam.
→ *Standard third conditional structure: past perfect in the if-clause + "would have" in the result clause.*
 2. If they **had left** earlier, they **would have caught** the train.
→ *Hypothetical past event that didn't happen.*
 3. If I **had not broken** my leg, I **could have run** in the race.
→ *"Could have" shows a past possibility that was missed.*
 4. We **would have arrived** on time if we **had not gotten** lost.
→ *Clauses reversed, no comma needed.*
 5. If he **had told** me about the meeting, I **would have come**.
→ *Hypothetical past regret.*
 6. She **would not have failed** the driving test if she **had not been** so nervous.
→ *Negative past hypothetical.*
 7. If the team **had trained** harder, they **might have won** the match.
→ *"Might have" expresses uncertainty about the past result.*
 8. **Had I known** about the traffic, I **would have left** earlier.
→ *Formal structure: "Had I known" instead of "If I had known".*
 9. If it **had not rained**, we **would have had** a picnic.
→ *Alternative third conditional form using continuous action.*
 10. If you **had listened** to my advice, you **would not have made** that mistake.
→ *Past hypothetical situation with a negative result.*

Exercise 2: Error Correction (Identifying & Fixing Mistakes) – Answers

1. ✗ If I **would have known** about the test, I would have studied.
✓ If I **had known** about the test, I would have studied.
2. ✗ If she **went** to bed earlier, she would have felt better.
✓ If she **had gone** to bed earlier, she would have felt better.
3. ✗ Had I **knew** about the problem, I would have solved it.
✓ Had I **known** about the problem, I would have solved it.
4. ✗ If we **took** a taxi, we would have arrived on time.
✓ If we **had taken** a taxi, we would have arrived on time.
5. ✗ If they **didn't miss** the flight, they wouldn't have been late.
✓ If they **hadn't missed** the flight, they wouldn't have been late.
6. ✗ If she hadn't **lose** her phone, she wouldn't have been upset.
✓ If she hadn't **lost** her phone, she wouldn't have been upset.
7. ✗ If I **studied** more, I would have passed the exam.
✓ If I **had studied** more, I would have passed the exam.
8. ✗ He wouldn't have missed the bus if he **sets** an alarm.
✓ He wouldn't have missed the bus if he **had set** an alarm.
9. ✗ If you had **be** more careful, you wouldn't have had an accident.
✓ If you had **been** more careful, you wouldn't have had an accident.
10. ✗ We would **of** called you if we had your number.
✓ We would **have** called you if we had your number.

Key Takeaways for Students

- ✓ **Third conditional** → **Past unreal/hypothetical situations** (*If I had studied, I would have passed.*)
- ✓ **Standard form** → **If + past perfect, would have + past participle**
- ✓ **Contracted form** → *If I'd known, I'd have told you.*
- ✓ **No comma needed when reversing clauses** → *I would have passed if I had studied.*
- ✓ **Formal alternative** → *Had I studied, I would have passed.*
- ✓ **Passive voice possible** → *If the meeting had been planned better, it would have finished on time.*
