

Reporting Verbs – Worksheet 1 – ANSWERS

Exercise 1: Gap-Fill (Choosing the Correct Reporting Verb & Structure) – Answers

1. **She offered to help** me with my homework.
→ "Offer" is followed by "to-infinitive".
2. **He admitted taking** the money from the drawer.
→ "Admit" is followed by verb-ing (or a perfect gerund: "having taken").
3. **The teacher suggested that we should submit** our assignments on time.
→ "Suggest" takes a "that-clause" or verb-ing: "suggested submitting".
4. **He apologised for forgetting** our anniversary.
→ "Apologise" is followed by "for + verb-ing".
5. **The lawyer advised her to stay** silent until she spoke to a solicitor.
→ "Advise" takes "object + to-infinitive".
6. **He denied that he had already given** me the correct documents.
→ "Deny" can take "that-clause" or verb-ing: "denied giving".
7. **The security guard warned them not to enter** the restricted area.
→ "Warn" takes "object + not + to-infinitive".
8. **She reminded me to call** her before the meeting.
→ "Remind" takes "object + to-infinitive".
9. **I encouraged him to take** a break because he was exhausted.
→ "Encourage" takes "object + to-infinitive".
10. **They promised to lower** the price if we bought two.
→ "Promise" is followed by "to-infinitive".

Explanation:

- **Verb + to-infinitive** → offer, promise, refuse, agree, decide
 - **Verb + object + to-infinitive** → advise, remind, encourage, warn
 - **Verb + (that) clause** → suggest, explain, deny, insist
 - **Verb + preposition + verb-ing** → apologise for, admit to, complain about
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✓ Exercise 2: Error Correction (Fixing Mistakes in Reporting Verbs) – Answers

1. ✗ He suggested me to apply for the job.
✓ He suggested **that I apply/ applying** for the job.
→ "Suggest" does not take "object + to-infinitive". Use a "that-clause" or verb-ing: "suggested applying".
2. ✗ She encouraged that I take the exam.
✓ She encouraged **me to take** the exam.
→ "Encourage" takes "object + to-infinitive".
3. ✗ He apologised to tell me the wrong information.
✓ He apologised **for telling** me the wrong information.
→ "Apologise" is followed by "for + verb-ing".
4. ✗ They explained me that they had missed the flight.
✓ They explained **that they had missed** the flight.
→ "Explain" does not take an indirect object.
5. ✗ I insisted him to take the medicine.
✓ I insisted **that he take** the medicine.
→ "Insist" does not take "object + to-infinitive". Use a "that-clause".
6. ✗ She promised that she call me later.
✓ She promised **that she would call/ to call** me later.
→ "Promise" in reported speech shifts tenses ("will" → "would").
7. ✗ He regretted to tell his boss about the mistake.
✓ He regretted **telling** his boss about the mistake.
→ "Regret" is followed by verb-ing unless used before "to say/inform".
8. ✗ The doctor advised me that drink more water.
✓ The doctor advised **me to drink** more water.
→ "Advise" takes "object + to-infinitive".
9. ✗ She denied to take my phone.
✓ She denied **taking** my phone.
→ "Deny" is followed by verb-ing.
10. ✗ They reminded that I need to bring my passport.
✓ They reminded **me to bring** my passport.
→ "Remind" takes "object + to-infinitive".

📌 Explanation:

- Verbs like "suggest", "insist", "explain" do **not** take an object before "that-clause".
- Verbs like "encourage", "remind", "advise", "warn" require an **object + to-infinitive**.
- "Apologise for", "deny", "regret" take **verb-ing**.
- Tense changes occur in reported speech ("will" → "would").
